THE LOUVRE ESTATE

Discover the history of the Louvre, its gardens and its neighborhood.

THE LOUVRE ESTATE

Formerly a royal palace, the Louvre embraces eight centuries of French history. Intended as a universal museum since its inception in 1793, its collections—among the finest in the world—span several thousands of years and a territory that extends from America to the confines of Asia.

The Louvre is a universal museum with eight curatorial departments: Egyptian Antiquities; Near Eastern Antiquities; Greek, Etruscan and Roman Antiquities; Paintings; Sculptures; Decorative Arts; Prints and Drawings; and Islamic Art. Some 35,000 works of art are on display, including world-famous masterpieces such as the Winged Victory of Samothrace, the Seated Scribe, the Winged Bulls of Khorsabad, the Mona Lisa and Michelangelo's Slaves, and parts of the palace, such as the Napoleon III Apartments, are works of art in their own right.

A ninth department, devoted to Byzantine and Eastern Christian Art, is being created and is scheduled to open in 2025.

THE GARDENS

The Louvre Estate includes both the Carrousel and Tuileries gardens. These historical parks offer beautiful settings for a leisurely walk and seasonal activities for all the family to enjoy. The Tuileries gardens were created during the Renaissance by Catherine de' Medici. Their complete redesign was undertaken in 1664 by André Le Nôtre, Louis XIV's gardener. In the 18th century, the gardens were decorated with statues and vases. An array of sculptures on loan from museums of modern and contemporary art are tucked into the groves.

THE MUSÉE NATIONAL EUGÈNE-DELACROIX

The Musée National Eugène – Delacroix is set in the apartment and studio where Eugène Delacroix (1798-1863) lived and worked for several years, from 1857 until his death. The artist-designed studio and lovely garden that he created as a retreat in the heart of Paris are the highlights of a secret space, not to be missed. The museum's collection has expanded over the years and now comprises paintings, drawings, prints, and letters written by Delacroix and his contemporaries. It thus sheds light on the painter's work and creative process from multiple angles: Romantic painting, travels in Morocco, religious painting, large decorative works...

The Louvre is seeking to position itself as a key French public player, in terms of both low-carbon issues, and social and cultural questions. Committed to an OSR approach, the Musée du Louvre has, for example, received ISO 50001 certification for its energy management system.

ADMISSION

€22. Free for -18 year-olds and -26 year-old residents of the European Economic Area. Guided tours, storytelling sessions and workshops: €9 to €12. Guided tours, storytelling sessions and workshops + museum ticket: €31. Group reservation (from 7 to 25 people): group reservation fee € 70 + an individual ticket per participants.

Methods of payment

CB/Visa, Mastercard, American Express, cash and holiday vouchers (ANCV). Holiday voucher payment grants reduced rates for activities.

OPENING HOURS

Open daily, except Tuesdays, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., and until 9 p.m. on Wednesdays and Fridays from May 29. Closed on 1 January, 1 May and 25 December.

ACCESS

The Pyramid is the main entrance to the museum. The Richelieu entrance is reserved for groups.

BOOKING CONDITIONS

TERMS

Booking a time slot is strongly recommended. Book your ticket at <u>Louvre.fr</u>. Reservations are compulsory during the Olympic Games.

INDIVIDUAL TICKETS

Individual tickets for the permanent collections and temporary exhibitions can be booked online at <u>Louvre.fr</u>. You can also book guided tours, workshops and other events through this link.

BOOKING A GROUP TIME SLOT

Time slots for group tours of the permanent collections and temporary exhibitions can be booked online at <u>Louvre.fr</u>. Time-slot bookings are compulsory for groups of 7 to 25 people maximum. The group reservation fee is €70 and the ticket cost per paying participant is €22. Time slots are available between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m, and until 7.15pm on Wednesdays and Fridays from May 29.

Up to the day before your visit, you can change the number of visitors and, according to availability, the date and time of your visit. If the time slot is changed, participants' tickets must also be modified to correspond to the new time slot selected.

Compulsory booking:

To ensure the best possible visiting conditions, all visitors from 1 July to 8 September must book a ticket ahead of time.

Access:

The Metro stations 'Palais-Royal-Musée du Louvre', 'Louvre-Rivoli' and 'Pyramides' will remain open during this period.

Days of closure:

The museum will be closed on 25 and 26 July. The Tuileries Garden will be closed on 28 August.

Cultural programming:

The Louvre will be at the heart of the 2024 Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games, with a programme of cultural events sparking dialogue between sport and the arts.

Open from Wednesday to Monday from 9.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. Late opening on the first Thursday of every month. Closed on 1 January, 1 May and 25 December.

Admission: €7. Free for under-26 year-old residents of the EEA. Admission to the museum is free for everyone on the first Sunday of every month and on 14 July.
